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Goodnight Middle School Parent and Family Engagement Policy

Purpose

- Content and community events and resources
- Parent/teacher conference
- Organizing school and community events

Goodnight Middle School will use different ways of communicating with parents and families to increase outreach. These will include:

- Phone calls, emails, text messages
- District website
- Social Media (Twitter and Facebook)
- Home and community visits, porch wellness visits
- SMCISD Mobile App

We will commit to communication in both English and Spanish with our families.

Campus Support

Goodnight Middle School has initiated a campus committee that will focus on parent and student engagement (PaSE). The campus PaSE Committees will provide our faculty and staff the opportunity to see our students and families in a different environment. This opportunity will include:

- Effective ways of reaching out to parents and community in order to build positive relationships

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- Creating a welcoming and service-oriented school setting
- Partnership with GEAR-UP, CIS, AVID, Rural Talent Search

Training

Goodnight Middle School will provide training to parents/families throughout the school year. The training will include (but is not limited to):

- Helping parents and families understand what the State of Texas and GMS expects students to learn for each grade level
- Helping parents and families understand how the State and GMS will check to see if students have met the expectations
- Helping parents and families understand how they can check to see how their child is doing in school
- Helping parents and families understand how they can help their child if he/she is not doing well in school

District Support

SMCISD will support our campus efforts to engage parents and families in order to help student learning by:

- Providing funds to our campus to purchase materials and provide learning opportunities to parents and families
- Collaborating with community organizations such as Randolph Brook Federal Credit Union, A+ Credit Union, Cenikor, Centro Esperanza, Centro Cultural Hispanico de San Marcos, Rural Talent Search, Texas State University, Greater San Marcos Youth Council (GSMYC) to promote parent and family engagements that will help parents and families understand community resources and opportunities on how to access them.

CAMPUS CONTACTS

Our campus has an available point of contact for parents and families. Our Counselors and Parent Liaison are a very important link between home and school and provide a great service to our parents and families in many ways including:

- Contacting teachers
- Providing information about after school programs that are available
