## **Classroom Expectations:**

- 1. We are Safe.

  - Use kind words and actions.
  - Be open to everyone's differences.
- 3. We are Responsible.
  - Be physically and mentally prepared.
  - Own your actions.

## **Grading Criteria:**

Students may have grades in the following categories:

- 1. Daily homework, Checks for Understanding, and Daily Assessments (minor grades)
- 2. Quizzes, Common Assessments, Projects (major grades)
- 3. Warm-Ups, Cool-Downs, Exit tickets, and Critical Writing (minor grades)

#### **Minor Grades = 40% of final grade**

**Major Grades = 60% of final grade** 

## **Grading Policy:**

Students are expected to come to class with assigned work completed the day that it is due. The student is advised to **show their work** on their homework so that we, other teachers, and other students are able to understand the thought process behind the solution they've found.

## Late Work Policy:

Work turned in after the expected due date will result in a **10-point deduction** applied to the submitted work. Late work will not be collected after the Interim Progress Reports (every three weeks).

# **Redemption Policy:**

It is the student's responsibility to make the teacher aware of their desire to make-up a failing major or daily grade. Daily grades can be made up until the end of the Interim Progress Report. Regarding major grades, the student will have up to **one week** after the assessment has been passed back to submit the appropriate corrections.

# **Bonus/Extra Credit:**

Bonus problems may be given occasionally on tests or on daily assignments. The student will not be penalized if the answer is wrong, only rewarded if it is correct. We expect the students to try their best every day.

# Hallway Pass Policies:

Students may use a hallway pass **twice per week** in our classroom. Being called out of class by the office or by another teacher will not be counted toward their weekly hall passes. The same policy may not apply in other classrooms.

# **Tutorials:**
