Students will also review basic grammatical and mechanical skills in writing applications. In our contemporary literature studies, students will read in multiple genres and will interpret possible influences of the historical context of the literary works to real life. Students will hone their communication and critical thinking skills. The Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills (TEKS) are the fundamental standards for our studies.
